Progression to Secondary 3

- Common Academic Requirement
- Students to attain subject overall mark of at least 50% (regardless of subject level) in:
- a. English Language and 2 subjects, or
- b. At least half the total number of examinable subjects offered

At the end of Sec 2 and Sec 3, students must meet the common academic requirement to offer subjects at the same subject levels the following year.

Progressing through Secondary School Years with Full Subject-Based **Banding (Full SBB)**

With Full SBB, all secondary school students will generally progress to the next year of learning. They have the flexibility to adjust their subject levels at appropriate junctures based on their overall strengths, interests and learning needs, and the school's holistic

This infographic shows how students can adjust their curricular load across the secondary years. By giving students greater ownership of their learning, we ho that they will develop a growth mindset an intrinsic motivation to learn for life.






